ABSTRACT: The aim of the investigation was to obtain information on homosexual persons.

GEOGRAPHIC LOCATION: South Africa

IMPORTANT VARIABLES: Gays and gay clubs in general, gay identity/identification and revelation, roles, present involvement, teenage experiences, aspects and levels of relationships, gay baths, attitude of friends/ employment, cause of/attitude towards homosexuality, view of psychologists/treatment, gay rights, importance of social aspects in life.

DEMOGRAPHIC VARIABLES: Sex, age, home language, income, education, occupation, social class, religion

UNIVERSE: White South African homosexuals, male and female

SAMPLING: Ad hoc random sample
