SUMMARY: The main purpose of this study is to make available socio-economic characteristics of residents of Vredendal North to all interest groups concerned. The questionnaire consists of three sections. The first section pertains to the socio-economic characteristics of all residents from each residential unit involved in the test sample and is presented in the first section of the report. In the second section of the questionnaire respondents report on home ownership, type of housing, number and nature of rooms and facilities in the residence, and room density. Section three contains questions on facilities and services in the community and on development priorities for the town.

IMPORTANT VARIABLES: Age, gender, levels of literacy and skill; income, occupation, housing situations, land rights, agricultural interests, community needs, membership of community organization, access to education facilities, health services and transport.

GEOGRAPHIC LOCATION: Vredendaal, Cape Town, South Africa
